PHA 1101: Hazing: Ethics, Etiquette, and Evolution

Upon completion of this course, University participants should be able to:

- 1. Recognize federal and state hazing laws.
- 2. Recall the various types and descriptions of physical and mental hazing.
- 3. Recognize the most frequently reported hazing behaviors.
- 4. Review potential reasons why hazing occurs and myths associated with hazing.
- 5. Review the financial consequences of hazing to the Grand Lodge and Jerusalem Grand Chapter.
- 6. Discuss professional, masonic etiquette for the intake of new members.
- 1. Analyze effective, sequential methods by which the membership may evolve, such that hazing shall be completely eradicated in the State of Florida.
- 2. Participate in group presentations or masonic educational cases to highlight the importance of the aforementioned competencies.
- 7. Take a summative exam to assess competency comprehension.
